

No, Medicaid Work Requirements Aren't Racist or Cruel, *The American Spectator*, by David Catron, January 15, 2018, Excerpts

The usual suspects trot out the usual lies about a policy proven to work.

When the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) announced that states could experiment with work requirements and volunteer community service as prerequisites for Medicaid eligibility, the melodramatic response from the Democrats and their media allies was as predictable as it was mendacious. House Democratic Leader Nancy Pelosi summed up the position of her congressional accomplices by vehemently denouncing the new CMS policy as "mean-spirited," "cynical," and "spiteful." And USA Today captured the gist of the "news" coverage with a work of fiction titled, "Medicaid work requirements are a throwback to rejected racial stereotypes."

The *USA Today* op-ed constitutes a classic example of the smug ignorance for which progressives are so notorious. Its authors obviously assume that white people would somehow escape the imagined negative effects of the new CMS policy. If these "journalists" had bothered to do their homework, they would realize that the single largest ethnic cohort of non-elderly Medicaid enrollees consists of white people

What seems to have been forgotten is that work requirements for government benefits is not an untested idea. In August of 1996, under considerable bipartisan pressure from Congress, President Clinton signed a welfare reform bill, a conspicuous provision of which was a work requirement not unlike that which CMS has authorized the states to use with Medicaid enrollees. At the time, the work requirement was denounced by the left as was Clinton himself. Critics of welfare reform, like today's critics of CMS, portentously predicted wrack and ruin. But, as those notorious right-wingers at the Brookings Institution reported, "Welfare Reform Worked."

So, based on the apparent success of consumer-driven Medicaid reform in Indiana and positive results of the work requirements associated with welfare reform on a national scale, the decision by the Trump administration to "support state efforts to test incentives that make participation in work or other community engagement a requirement for continued Medicaid eligibility" seems pretty sound. That impression is evidently shared by the officials of a number of states. Kentucky was the first state to take advantage of the new CMS policy, and, according to Reuters, Arizona, Arkansas, Indiana, Kansas, Maine, New Hampshire, North Carolina, Utah, and Wisconsin may soon follow suit.

Democrat/MSM propaganda notwithstanding, the CMS decision to support states that wish to use a work requirement as a prerequisite for continued Medicaid eligibility for able-bodied adults seems eminently reasonable. Medicaid reform is one of the nation's most pressing domestic issues and the Trump administration is simply allowing the states to bring their creative energy to bear on the problem. This is not racist. This is not mean-spirited. It is an all-too-rare commodity called "leadership."



The Republican Club of Venice High School



To Deregulate America, Dump DC Bureaucrats, by Betsey McCaughey, December 20, 2017, Excerpts, Submitted by Don O'Nesky; Betsy McCaughey is a senior fellow at the London Center for Policy Research and a former lieutenant governor of New York State.

Flanked by a towering 185,00 pages representing the federal regulatory code now and a short pile of 20,000 pages—the code's length a half-century ago—President Trump pledged last week to return us to the days of fewer regulations. Pointing to the colossal pile, which would take some three years to read, the president reiterated what Americans know firsthand, that "every unnecessary page" means "projects never get off the ground."

Trump claims he's already eliminated 22 rules for every new one imposed this past year. His critics dispute how many he's actually scrapped, but no one denies he's brought the steady stream of new rules nearly to a halt. This regulatory pause is buoying business optimism and the stock market.


What's coming next? Rolling back rules on mining, manufacturing, oil exploration, banking, you name it. Even better, both the Trump administration and some Democrats in Congress want to relocate federal agencies from inside the D.C. beltway to cities in the nation's heartland. Getting Washington out of Washington.

Imagine regulators having to rub elbows with the people being regulated. There's a lot of wisdom outside the Washington bubble. Why should federal management be concentrated so far from the industries and people affected?

Earlier this year, the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee voted to "Divest D.C." and identify agencies easiest to move. The idea has bipartisan support. Rep. Tim Ryan, D-Ohio, sees it as a way to repopulate economically depressed cities that offer cheaper office space and housing, less traffic and a lower cost of living for federal workers.

Of course, not all federal workers residing in D.C. will move willingly, and opponents of the idea claim it's a covert way to shrink the federal workforce. All the better, says Philip Howard, chairman of Common Good. "Agencies should be moved out of D.C. and repopulated with people looking to help Americans, not stifle them."

And not deliberately thwart the policies of the president. One of Trump's biggest challenges is taming the "deep state"—and now two million federal bureaucrats strong—burrowed deep in agencies across the capitol region. Dispersing it is one way.
